## Give your child the Power to Read!

# Need Books? Visit a Book Box!

As part of the community's interest in encouraging children to read, free book boxes have been set up at locations around the city. These re-purposed newspaper vending boxes hold books that children may borrow. Students can return the borrowed book, or donate gently-used books of their own. The boxes are located outdoors, and can be accessed at any time, regardless of whether the school is open.

Book boxes are located at each elementary school in the Auburn Enlarged City School District (at the front entrance to the school, except for the Seward Book Box, which is located at the side entrance facing Metcalf Drive). There is also one located in front of the education building of Westminster Presbyterian Church, adjacent to the YMCA.
